

POLICE EVIDENCE HANDOFF — WHAT TO GIVE, WHERE TO GIVE IT

For: Alaedean Hamed

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This document tells you exactly what to print/bring to Bloomington PD and what to say. It's designed so you can act on it without thinking.

■ STEP 1 — CALL 911 NOW IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY

Dial **911** and say:

> "I have just received verbal death threats by voicemail (in which Evan Bosma is heard in the background during one of Bri Bosma's 11 calls between 4:31 PM and 4:34 PM CST) and text message. The
> caller is Bri Bosma at 612-716-9997. Her husband Evan Bosma also called from
> the same household. I have audio evidence and screenshots. I am in fear for
> my safety. The voicemail is recorded today, August 2, 2026, between 4:31 PM and 4:34 PM CST."

Stay on the line. Follow the dispatcher's instructions. They will either send an officer to you, or direct you to file in person.

■ STEP 2 — GO IN PERSON TO BLOOMINGTON PD

Address: 13820 West 78th Street, Bloomington, MN 55438

Phone: (952) 563-4900

Open 7 days a week. Walk in. Front desk will take your report.

■ STEP 3 — WHAT TO BRING

■ THE ONLY THREE THINGS YOU NEED TO BRING:

1. Your mobile phone (with the voicemail still in the voicemail system)

- This is the ORIGINAL evidence. Don't delete it.

- Subpoena to Verizon (carrier of +1 612-716-9997) will recover the original voicemail metadata even if deleted.

2. The evidence package ZIP on a USB drive

- Download once: <https://nutronelements.com/evidence/evidence-package.zip>
- File is 141 KB. Fits on any USB drive.
- Contains: voicemail recording, 2 screenshots, full report, manifest.

3. Printout of the police report

- Download once: <https://nutronelements.com/police-report-threats.md>
- Convert to PDF using Word/Pages/Google Docs
- Or just open the .md file on your phone

THAT'S IT. Don't bring anything else.

■ STEP 4 — WHAT *NOT* TO BRING

- **DO NOT bring the full 21,000+ message SMS export.**

This is an FYI for context only. Even though the manual excerpts on ``/evidence-sms.html`` show damning admissions from Evan, the full corpus contains messages from both sides using hostile language. The current evidence package focuses on the strongest single-incident evidence (voicemail death threat + screenshots). A defense attorney would argue mutual hostility if the full SMS log were in evidence.

- **DO NOT bring screenshots of your own text messages.** Same reason.
 - **DO NOT bring the consumer-warning website printout.** It's not relevant to the threat complaint. The threats reference the site but don't require the site itself to be in evidence.
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■■ STEP 5 — WHAT TO SAY AT THE FRONT DESK

Walk up to the front desk and say:

- > "I want to file a police report about a death threat I received today.
- > I have audio evidence, screenshots, and a typed statement. I also want
- > to apply for an Order for Protection under Minnesota Statute 609.748."

The desk officer will:

1. Ask you to sit and tell your story in your own words
2. Take your written statement
3. Look at your phone evidence

4. Provide a case number — **SAVE THIS NUMBER**
 5. Either issue an Order for Protection on the spot OR direct you to court to file one
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■ STEP 6 — THE STORY YOU TELL THE OFFICER

Speak naturally. Don't memorize. Here's a simple framework:

- > "I worked as a former contractor for Evan Bosma's company Nutrition Excellence LLC from
 - > December 2025 through August 2026 as a former contractor. Today
 - > I published a consumer-warning website documenting regulatory
 - > violations I witnessed while employed there.
 - >
 - > This afternoon at 4:31 PM I started receiving calls and messages
 - > from Evan Bosma and his wife Bri Bosma. Bri left me a 31-second
 - > voicemail saying 'I'm gonna fucking kill you, bitch' and demanding
 - > I take down the website or I'll go to prison. I have the voicemail
 - > recording on my phone and screenshots of the text-message thread.
 - >
 - > Evan also called. His text messages before this incident include
 - > admissions about unsanitary manufacturing, product substitution
 - > between states, and installing surveillance software on my personal
 - > laptop without my consent. I have filed related consumer-protection
 - > complaints with FDA, FBI, Minnesota OCM, North Dakota Department of
 - > Agriculture, and Minnesota Department of Health.
 - >
 - > I'm not in physical danger right this moment but I'm in fear based on
 - > the explicit death threat just received. I would like an Order for
 - > Protection under MN Statute 609.748."
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■■ STEP 7 — REQUEST AN ORDER FOR PROTECTION (HRO)

Under **Minnesota Statute § 609.748**, you can request a Harassment Restraining Order against Evan and Bri Bosma.

Tell the officer explicitly:

> "I want to apply for a Harassment Restraining Order under Minnesota
> Statute 609.748 against both Evan Bosma and Bri Bosma. They live
> at 10740 Lyndale Avenue, Suite 11W, Bloomington, MN 55420."

The HRO prohibits them from:

- Contacting you in any form (calls, texts, emails, third parties)
- Coming within a specified distance of you
- Coming to your home or workplace
- Possessing a firearm (during the order's duration)

****An HRO granted on the spot is the strongest immediate protection available.**** If the officer says you need to go to court, ask which court and ask for a same-day emergency hearing.

■ STEP 8 — REFERENCE INFORMATION

In case the officer asks:

Statutory basis for the threat:

- Minnesota Statute § 609.713 — Terroristic Threats (Felony)
- Minnesota Statute § 609.749 — Stalking (Felony)
- Minnesota Statute § 609.2231 — 4th-Degree Assault

- Minnesota Statute § 609.748 — Order for Protection

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■ STEP 9 — AFTER YOU FILE

1. **Save your case number.** Write it down. You'll need it for follow-up.
 2. **Ask for the officer's name and badge number.** Write it down.
 3. **Ask for a copy of the police report.** They may email or mail it.
 4. **Document any further contact.** If Bri or Evan call/text/message you in ANY way after today, document it (screenshot, time, content) and report it to Bloomington PD.
 5. **Do NOT take down the consumer-warning website.** Doing so could be interpreted as witness tampering or destruction of evidence.
 6. **Do NOT engage with Evan or Bri further.** Every response you send becomes evidence. Silence is your friend.

■■ IF YOU FEEL IMMEDIATELY THREATENED

1. Leave your current location immediately.
 2. Call 911 from a safe location.
 3. Go to the nearest hospital emergency room.
 4. Hospital security can assist with police contact.

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■ WHAT IF THE OFFICER DOESN'T TAKE THE REPORT?

Some officers may try to dismiss this as "just a text message." If that happens:

- > "Sir/ma'am, this is an explicit verbal death threat, recorded as a voicemail
- > from a known individual at a known address. The voicemail is audibly preserved.
- > Minnesota Statute § 609.713 makes this a felony. I would like this report
- > taken. If you cannot take the report, please provide me with the name of
- > your supervisor so I can speak with them."
